WION-der-land Radio!

WION's owner and on-air personality, along with program Director Jim Aren, welcomed the members of the ICHS to the radio station studio on March 7, 2007.

Jim began his narrative by explaining the broadcasting equipment in the studio where the meeting had taken place. The station utilizes a host of digital gadgetry to broadcast both live and pre-recorded audio. He points out that all this technology allows the station to broadcast "in color." The daytime broadcasts are in real-time, including Gary Osborn (who broadcasts from his home!), whereas the evening and night-time programming is entirely automated.

Many anecdotes and personal experiences were related by the members regarding their memories of the radio station. Started in 1953 by

Monroe MacPherson, the station rapidly became a prominent part of the community. Jim recently found the "first day" logs for the station and hopes to frame these for the station walls in the near future. He also spoke about the evolution of the station's technology, and noted that plans are under way to improve the




broadcasting power and clarity over the next few months.

ICHS members asked about the programming at the station, such as the Twilight Zone shows, and shows of the past such as Tiger Baseball games. Jim pointed out that broadcasting these shows costs a lot of money, and it's just not practical for small stations these

days, especially with competition from digital radio.

The members were then invited to wander about the station to see Jim's fascinating collection of radios and memorabil-

ia, asking questions and sharing stories as they went. The visit was very enjoyable, and we thank Jim and Jim - and Tom Millard, the station's salesman for their hospitality.

And, in regards to the Free Fair, a call was received from Amy Smith to ask if the Historical Society would be sponsoring the usual awards for the Art Deparment, and the judges as well. It was moved by Gerry Perry and supported by Joan McCord to do so, and the motion carried. David McCord, Stephanie VanderMolen, and Gerry Perry will serve as judges, scheduled for July 21st. Stephanie also suggested offering the artists the opportunity to hang their winning pieces in the Blanchard House for a time.

A letter was received from the Genealogy Society inviting people to register as "first families" - being a roster of families who settled in the county prior to 1880.

A group from the Voigt House musem in Grand Rapids will be visiting the Blanchard House on March 31, and the visit will be hosted by the McCords.

Dave Cook asked for loans of travel videos for a series he is presenting at the Ionia Theatre on Thursday mornings. Contact him at the Theatre office.

The Ionia Community Dinner will be at the High School on March 27th, and a new vote on the new Library building is coming up on May 8th.

The April meeting will be at the Blanchard House, with refreshments by Joan Nixon and Mary Metzen, and the program will be about "Prehistoric Settlers" of Ionia

Barbara Steele, anappraiser, will do a portrayal of an 1880's lady and, after a pot-luck lunch, she will discuss appraising buttons, jewelry, glassware, and china. The event will be held at Belding's Bellrocton from 11:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. tickets are \$10 each.

Tuesday, April 17th, the Tri River Group will meet at the Blanchard House at 10:00 a.m.
