Scouting is Historic!

Randy and Al Meyers arrived about an hour early for the September 5th ICBS meeting. They had a trailer load of very special displays to bring into the Blanchard House, unpack, and set up for the members to see. They had the help of a few local Boy Scouts, appropriately enough.

Introduced by local Scouter (and ICBS Secretary) David McCord, the Meyers Traveling Scout Museum was the program for the evening.

Randy began with the story of how he had become interested in Scouting memorabilia, starting with a few family heirlooms and beginning to acquire others from yard sales and friends. After a while, the collection began to outgrow the storage bins and closet shelves in their home near Zeeland.

His wife, Al, encouraged him to put together some display cabinets so the artifacts could be shared with others. Soon, the museum began to generate some word-of-mouth attention, and scouting families from all over began to inquire about the collection - and even more - to make donations to it.

Al Meyers then began to take an interest in Girl Scouting and its affiliated organizations. (It was only natural!) And so their collection of GSA artifacts grew as well.

The research has been sometimes difficult (don't believe everything you read on the Internet!), but always interesting... even exciting. From scrapbooks and newspaper articles to the eagerly shared stories of life-long scouters, Al and Randy have brought together a splendid display of the history of Scouting (now 100 years young) and the significant contributions that it has made - and continues to make - in the lives of its members, of communities around the world, and particularly to our own country.

Thanks to the Meyers for their wonderful display, the stories they shared, and their enthusiasm for scouting!
