Plans, Programs, & Projects

In this issue:

This Chronicle is summarizing the major projects that have been underway this year, and documenting a few of the upcoming activities on the calendar. Most of these items have been discussed at the regular monthly meetings, but some of the details are new for the fall schedule. We hope to see you all at these future meetings!

Coming this fall:

Wednesday, September 2nd, 7:00 p.m. —

The monthly program at the Blanchard House will be special guest Chris Engemann, a former automotive engineer and member of the Shelby Auto Club, to talk about the Shelby automobiles that were built here in Ionia in the late 60s. The Historical Society is creating some commemorative T-shirts that will depict these cars as a souvenir of the plant. (These may be ready by the September meeting.)

On a related note, plans are under way to erect a small monument on the site of the factory to mark the site and describe the significance of the factory, from the Ypsilanti-Reed Furniture Company through the final days of GenCorp. And don't forget the documentary DVD about the factory produced earlier this year by students from Ferris State University (available from our souvenir shop for only \$10)!

One more important item for the September meeting: This will be the deadline for nominations for three openings on the ICHS Board of Directors. The election will be at the October annual meeting, and any paid members as of that meeting will be able to vote for those candidates.

Wednesday, October 7th, 7:00 p.m. —

interested in the historical items of the trip, they'll share some of what they experienced of the past along the northwest coast.



Plans for December and beyond include the following:

- The December 2nd meeting will be the annual Holiday Pot Luck. Seasonal decorations will be in place, sponsored by area non-profit groups, and special music will be presented by Shannon Hughes.
- December also includes the annual Mrs. Claus Bazaar, where the ICHS sponsors a booth with souvenirs and gift items for sale. Volunteers are welcome to help!
- Holiday Open Houses every Sunday in December, at which the Blanchard House is open to the public in the afternoons for tours, and to show off the Christmas decorations.
- The January 6th meeting will be held at the First Christian Church of Ionia. February's meeting is still to be arranged. In March we will once again share a program with the Ionia Community Library.


Other Important Issues

The Historical Society will soon have a "throw" for sale. A small custom-woven blanket depicting several Ionia area landmarks. This throw will be available in several color schemes, and will make a fabulous gift as well as a souvenir of our community. They'll sell for just \$75 each (pictured below), and paid ICHS members get a \$10 discount!



The ICHS is working on a commemorative "Coffee Table" book to document the 100-year history of the Ionia Free Fair. The research and writing is presently under way, plus photos and stories are still being collected for the project. There are two ways that interested folks can help with this project:

First, the ICHS has a Centennial Calendar available for purchase which includes historic facts and photographs of the Free Fair. This 16-month calendar is available for only \$15, and the proceeds will go to help finance the publication of the book next spring. (Calendar cover pictured below.)



Another way you can help is to join us to collect and identify photos, and research the historic facts through news, documents, and personal recollections. In addition to this book project (estimated to be several hundred pages, available in both hard-cover and paperback), Goose Elliot is working on a picture book through Arcadia Publishing to commemorate the Free Fair. This will be a smaller book, primarily of historic photos, to chronicle the century of "Michigan's Greatest Outdoor Event."

All of these recent projects have brought hundreds of historic Ionia Free Fair photos and documents into the ICHS collections, and volunteers will be needed to help properly preserve these rare and significant artifacts.

The Blanchard House trim was repainted this past summer (thanks to Greg Cook & company) and some less-visible repairs and maintenance performed. If anyone is interested in helping with the maintenance of the house and grounds, please contact the Board of Directors. There's plenty of work to be done!

The Tri-River Museum Group, of which the ICHS is a charter member, holds their monthly meeting. This association of 24 Mid-Michigan Museums has been a tremendous affiliation over the years, sharing ideas, events, and publicity. The ICHS delegate to the Tri-River Group is Joni McCord, who will be stepping down from the position in October. 
