#### MINUTES of the October 6, 2010 Membership Mtg

The October 6, 2010 meeting of the Ionia County Historical Society was called to order at 7:00 p.m. at the Blanchard House by President Linda Ciangi. (Approximatley 30 were in attendance.) She began by welcoming members and guests to the meeting, specifically Jim Finall, who brought with him several items from the estate of Kent McFadden, ICHS member who passed away recently. This included several framed artifacts pertaining to local railroads, as well as some books and photos. Thanks to Mr. Finall.

Being the eve of the Annual Meeting, the president shared her thanks to the many members and friends of the Society for the past year's activities, and attributed specific successes to chairpersons, officers, and elected officials of the organization.

Next on the agenda were the usual reports. Robert Nixon moved to accept the secretary's report as published, which was supported by Mike Gallagher and passed. Treasurer Hank Knoop delivered his report of September's financial activities, noting that it was a successful month, including the Duck Race at the Fall Festival (with thanks to Pearson's Orchard for apples) and a major influx of memberships paid. He also reported that the new roof for the carriage house actually came in under budget, with many thanks to all parties involved. It was moved by Bob Nixon and supported by Barb Ehlert to accept the treasurer's report, which passed.

Joan McCord was not present to deliver a report on the October 2 Upstairs Downtown Tours, but they were deemed a great success, in spite of threatening weather. About 70 people bought tickets and a few made additional contributions for a total of \$722 income. There are four new sites asking to be on the tour next year already! Beryl Bishop won the wreath of dollars (50), and she donated her prize back to the ICHS.

President Ciangi reported great progress being made in the sorting of artifacts (and junk) in the furnace/storage room, with thanks to the members who have been helping, and specifically to Barb Hogan for her expertise.

Thanks to Chuck Booth, who has helped with yard work and also stained the woodwork on the front porch of the Blanchard House. Also, thanks to the Garden Club for their continuing services, and for the bench in the back garden. Hank also reported that the rotting tree in front of the house actually fell into the street, and has been cleaned

# New Board Members Elected at Annual Meeting



#### MINUTES of the October 6, 2010 Annual Meeting

The 2010 Annual Meeting was called to order at the Blanchard House by President Linda Ciangi at approximately 8:00 p.m. on October 6 (immediately following the genereal membership meeting). Mike Gallagher moved to forego the first few items on the proscribed agenda for the annual meeting (as usual). This was supported by Kris Haskins and passed. The secretary noted that minutes of the meetings are available to any interested members in lieu of their being read.

The main item on the agenda was the election of two directors for the board. Outgoing directors Kathleen Larock and Barb Ehlert were duly thanked and applauded for their efforts and dedication over the past two years. The candidates for these two positions were then introduced and offered the floor for a few comments on their own behalf before the vote was taken. They were: Carol Gallagher, Jessica Roche, and Patty Simpson-Gokee. The secretary passed out the ballots, then

collected and counted the votes as the members took a break for refreshments

The new directors were then announced with congratulations: Carol and Patty. Thanks were expressed to Jessica, who was encouraged to continue to serve the ICHS in other ways.

The board was invited to meet briefly later in the evening to elect their officers and address any immediate topics of note, and the Annual Meeting was adjourned at approximately 8:30 p.m.

#### MINUTES of the October 6, 2010 Board Meeting

The new Board members attended their first (albeit brief) board meeting directly after the 2010 Annual Meeting at the Blanchard House. Present were all board members, Secretary David McCord, and outgoing director Barb Ehlert. The first order of business was the election of President. Carol Gallagher nominated Linda Ciangi, supported by Stephanie VanderMolen, and (there being no other nominations) she was elected unanimously.

Stephanie V. was nominated for Vice President by Kris Haskins, supported by Patty S. and elected unanimously. Hank Knoop was asked if he wanted to continue as Treasurer, and upon his positive response was duly elected. David McCord offered to continue as "recording secretary" and the board cast another unanimous ballot.

The Secretary noted that the Board mailing list would need updating on the Internet, and the directory of the board as well in the Chronicle with new phone numbers.

The new directors will need copies of the ByLaws (which are on file at the Blanchard House) and the disposition of keys to the house needs to be addressed, but was tabled for the time being.

The Board discussed the request from the Garden Club to have a party at the Blanchard House on December 3rd. The Board voted to waive the rental fee for them in recognition of their continued service. The Garden Club noted that they could change the date of their gathering if a "paying customer" wanted to rent the house that night.

The meeting was then adjourned.

#### MINUTES of the October 20th, 2010 Business Meeting

The October 20 business meeting of the ICHS was commenced about 7:00 p.m. at the Blanchard House. Present were the members of the board plus Secretary David McCord, Doni Knoop and Barb Ehlert. President Linda C. welcomed new board members Carol Gallagher and Patty Siimpson-Gokee to the meeting.

Several rental dates for the House were passed along to Stephanie V. to add to the web calendar.

It is still uncertain what we'll be doing for the Oct. 28 Chili Dog Challenge. Water and apples are the plan, but permission is still being clarified.

November 9th, the Ionia Community Foundation will be renting the House from 5:30 to 8:00 p.m. Linda will meet Maureen Meade for a walk-thru on Nov. 1.

The November 10 "Business After Hours" event is coming along. Linda C. shared her plans for the display, which are going to require some careful set-up plans due to a tight schedule.

November 13th "Expo" plans are in place. Stephanie will host. The event starts at 11:00 a.m - free admission to the public.

The Tri-River Group will be at the Blanchard House on November 16th. We expect 40 to 45 people for a "Victorian Tea" provided by Pat Stoakes. This gathering starts at 10:00 a.m.

Joe & Joan McCord have arranged for the Blanchard House to be a dropoff point for the WION Food Drive on Nov. 28th.

Decorating for Christmas by area merchants will be under way soon. Linda is making the arrangements. Kris will bring the trees down from the attic in time.

Framed photos need to be located to sell at the December 4 Bazaar at the Middle School. Doni and Barb are working on other items for sale as well.

The Blanchard House will be open for the holidays on December 5, 12, and 19. Hosts and hostesses are needed for these days. Barb Ehlert will be in charge of volunteers.

Chel Lea's rental for the Spiritual Gallery on December 19th may take a certain amount of planning for seating the 40 to 50 expected attendants. The event is scheduled from 6:00 to 8:00 (after our open house).

October 21st, a film student from Ionia High School is scheduled to be at the Blanchard House at 10:30 a.m. Linda C. will meet him here. Also, Justin Mayle also wants to film in the yard as well, This is a professional crew from Kalamazoo; confirmation is pending.

Some discussed was had regarding charging for use of the house in films and photos, and it was generally felt that rent might be charged if the party in question was going to make money from the process. The board was reminded of earlier discussions about renting the yard only for outdoor events. No decision was reached.

Thursday evening work sessions are going very well. Barb Hogan noted that more time would be nice, so (when possible) the sessions will start at 1:00 p.m. In the near-term, this will include cleaning for the Christmas activities.

Programs for January and February have been confirmed. (Refer to earlier notes for details.) Kris reports that the Christmas Concert is coming along well, and new promotional materials will be ready soon

Kris also reported that the yard clean up is coming along, but that more help would be nice. Thanks to Chuck Booth for his help. Kris is talking with Penny Beeman about more volunteers,



With no further business to address, the meeting was adjourned at 9:00 p.m.
