Dear ICHS Members and Friends,


It has been a fun and busy autumn starting with the Celebration of the City of Ionia

turning 150 years old. Of course, if something is happening in our hometown, we want to be a part of it. Our very own Linda Ciangi and David & Annette McCord were significant contributors in this event. The window and table displays of

artifacts at the theatre looked fabulous! David, all dressed up to play the part, gave a fantastic tribute to Ionia's first Honorable Mayor Frederick Hall. Linda, in Marion Hall-Fowler fashion, made sure that any child attending, would receive a book. On Sunday, the Blanchard House was open for tours, and the house looked especially beautiful. I was pleased to see so many volunteers to host this event.



In keeping with the theme of 1873, the characters in the **Cemetery Tour** were someone significant from that time. We sold 71 tickets and made a little extra money from concessions and gift shop items. I was happy that the weather cooperated, and we had the opportunity to teach local history. Tracy Hodgkins, owner of "Just Like Home Adult Daycare" loaned us her bus and Tom Millard offered to drive it. Words can not express my appreciation (and sigh of relief) of figuring out a way to safely get tourist to the top of the hill.

After much discussion, we decided that we will not give tours this year in the month of December. We will put up and decorate the large Christmas Tree in the parlor, but we will not decorate the house as we did in years past. The cost of heating the house and the lack of visitors


Ionia Free Fair Centennial 1915-2015

Most significant is this DVD Video on the history of Ionia's major employer for nearly 100 years, produced by






